

Eynsham Village Play Space

We think tree A is a Sycamore it definitely is a maple variety. It stands next to an area of hard standing that may be suitable for a seating area. There are trees on two sides which would give some shade - a request from many. It is too close to the fence to be integrated into an MPU
The scrubby Elder tree in the fence corner needs pruning.

The fence needs replacing from this point on the North side as well as the Western boundary.

We have identified 5 trees as suitable for integration into a natural MPU. They are all Alder.
These numbered 1-5 are plotted in position on the plan.
The remaining trees 6-14 are not accurately placed.
14 is a large birch with a huge stump behind.
11 is leaning
12 leans at top and is spindly
10 is puny and covered in ivy



1. Girth 1m, lean 10°. has fork could be removed or integrated



2. Girth 1m, vertical, no lower branches



3. Girth 1m, lean 10°



4. Girth 1.9m, straight trunk - the best tree!



5. Girth 0.85m, has spindly lower branches can be removed
