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The historic market village of Eynsham is the fourth largest settlement in West Oxfordshire. Eynsham Parish Council is the first of three tiers of local government. It has represented the interests of the people of Eynsham and Barnard Gate since 1894. It works with West Oxfordshire District Council and Oxfordshire County Council to deliver services to Eynsham's population of over 5,000.

Eynsham Parish Council represents the interests of the people of Eynsham and Barnard Gate. We are consulted on things like planning, public transport, road improvements, mineral and waste policy, and crime prevention.

It also contributes to local amenities such as allotments, bus shelters and litter bins; provides recreational facilities including community buildings, playing fields and the Abbey Fishponds; makes grants in aid of village clubs and charities; and arranges grass-cutting on behalf of the County Council.

At present the Council is actively involved in:

- Planning future development of the Parish
- Monitoring the local footpath network
- Exploring options for a 20mph maximum speed limit





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


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PARISH MAP



There are 13 Councillors (out of 15 available seats on the Council). Elections are held every 4 years with the next one scheduled for May 2023.

Eynsham Parish Council meetings are (usually) held on Tuesday evenings and are open to the public. A public participation session is available at the beginning of each meeting to raise matters with members. Meetings are held in the Village Hall.

OVERVIEW OF COMMITTEES

Amenities & Estates Committee

This committee is responsible for the maintenance and activities of its play areas and skate park, Abbey Fishponds, public open spaces (including the Chil Brook as riparian owner) and matters relating to footpaths, trees, hedges and street furniture.

Finance & General Purposes Committee

Meeting quarterly, this committee monitors financial compliance, recommends the annual budgets and precept to Full Council and overseas all staff-related matters. It also considers community grant aid applications, manages the Council's buildings and reviews the Council fees and charges.

Planning Committee

This committee responds to planning and licensing applications and is consulted on street-naming of new developments. It responds to consultations relating to Gravel & Minerals, Salt Cross Garden Village, West Eynsham Strategic Development Area, A40 proposals and submits representations on CIL/S106 developer contributions. It is also updating the Neighbourhood Plan.

Senior Committee

It is the responsibility of this committee to deal with special events as they occur where recourse to the appropriate committee or Full Council is not possible.

As a Parish Council, we work on your behalf – we want to know what issues you may have or what projects you may be working on so that we can champion your efforts and support where we can.



Our Objectives – The 'How'. The projects that we need to deliver to support each of our priorities. Each objective has an owner and a target deadline








