

Thames Valley Police Report for
Eynsham Annual Parish Meeting 2020
from your Eynsham Neighbourhood Police Team

1. Our current Local Policing Priorities are: Residential Burglaries, Domestic Abuse and County Drug Lines. We are very aware of the concerns of the village regarding the drug use and supply of drugs in Eynsham and the Neighbourhood Team have worked hard in reducing these issues. We have increased our patrols, used social media and local press to advertise our operations. We have made several arrests in relation to drugs and continue to maintain our patrols, submit intelligence and actively engage with those involved.
2. We still rely on the community to keep us informed of any current or emerging crime trends. If anything is concerning you, whether it be security advice, suspicious person or vehicles, concerns for a vulnerable child or adult or any other information you would like to pass, then we want to know. We can be contacted on 101, or via the online reporting form on the Thames Valley Police website. We also actively use social media and you are able to follow us on Facebook and Twitter. 3. We are making more use of the Thames Valley Alert System which is a great way that the Police can communicate with the public as well as receive messages back. 4. Eynsham Police office is still being used by the Neighbourhood Team and your local PCSO is Lucy James. Witney Neighbourhood Team also assist and you will see them patrolling Eynsham also.
