Scotland's going great guns! - Scotland's last coal energy plant — Longannet Power Station — was shut down in March. As the largest coal plant in Europe, Longannet was responsible for more than a fifth of Scotland's carbon emissions. The country is now coal-free, and making great strides towards forging a renewable and sustainable future for the UK. (Global Citizen News 9.17)

Local Authority Support - Community energy projects are more effective when provided with support from local authorities. Despite diminishing budgets and resources, local authorities still have the scale, credibility and administrative skill to support the drive, innovation and opportunities exhibited from local community energy organisations and together they can face and overcome some of the demands, challenges and barriers they are both facing. Fossil Fuel Divestment - A third of UK universities have now made a fossil fuel divestment pledge. The movement to end fossil fuel investments is growing with the total value of funds being withdrawn by higher education institutions globally reaching £80 billion. A study by Oxford University researchers suggests that no new CO₂ emitting electricity infrastructure can be built after this year, if warming is to stay within a 2°C target, unless other electricity infrastructure is retired early or retrofitted with carbon capture technologies.

WOW! - The UK's largest electric vehicle-charging network switched to 100% renewable energy last month.

International News

Pakistani province plants 1bn trees in two years! - The forests of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province, northwest Pakistan, have suffered from decades of felling and natural disasters. The new trees have been planted ahead of schedule and have a 70-90% survival rate - one of the highest in the world. They will help sustain the river banks and tackle climate change.

In contrast Norway has set up a state enterprise, Gassnova, with the sole purpose of coordinating efforts and seeing CCS realised in the country. **Come on UK!** (The Chemical Engineer No.915)

Outrageous - The International Energy Agency reports in excess of four times more in subsidies for fossil fuels than for renewables: \$490 billion compared to \$112 billion in 2014. This is true even in the G20 of richer nations, where \$71 billion per year went to fossil-fuel subsidies between 2013 and 2015, and \$18 billion to renewables. https://www.ft.com/
