Eynsham Traffic Working Group Meeting  
held at Eynsham Village Hall, 7.30pm  
on Tuesday 24 August 2021

## MINUTES

**Councillors Present** – Cllr R Macken (Chairman), Cllr Tricia Crowley and Cllr Sue Osborne.

Also in Attendance – Clerk to the Council. There were five members of the public present.

**21/T10 To receive apologies for absence** – None.

**21/T11 To receive Declarations of Interest in agenda items** – None.

**21/T12 Public Participation - to receive submissions from members of the public** - None.

**21/T13 To welcome Chris Hulme, Traffic Management Officer, Hampshire Constabulary & Thames Valley Police Joint Operations Unit, receive a briefing on enforcement of traffic speeds in Eynsham and procedure for reporting with anti-social driving** – Mr Hulme discussed two highway issues as follows:-

Antisocial behaviour/driving - Reports can be sent to the Police via the [Thames Valley Police website](#), calling 101 or [Crimestoppers](#) all of which can be done anonymously if needed. Removal of a vehicle from an offender is only undertaken when the behaviour is witnessed by the Police. Reports received by any of the above channels, will be raised with the Witney/Eynsham Area Neighbourhood Police Team who will visit the driver and initially warn them about their behaviour.

Enforcement - Trying to secure enforcement of any speed limit is difficult due to lack of resources. It was noted that a successful 20mph scheme will rely on highway engineering/features and signage particularly where the speeds prior to implementation of the scheme are about 24mph or more. Changes to speed limits need to accompany a change in the local environment. Community Speed Watch is recommended for low level enforcement – the highest level of enforcement is mobile van with camera where there is strong evidence of a speeding problem or fatalities.

Oxfordshire County Council is working on 20mph schemes with signs only which is moving away from national policy. It was noted that Yarnton has a good example of a low speed scheme.

It was agreed to invite Mr Hulme again to review final proposals. The remaining agenda items will be carried forward to the next meeting.
