## MINUTES

**Councillors Present** – Cllr Sue Osborne (Chairman), Cllr Tricia Crowley, Cllr Ross Macken and Sophia Vernon (co-opted member).

Also in attendance – Clerk to the Council. There were no members of the public present.

**22/T20 To receive apologies for absence** - None.

**22/T21 To receive Declarations of Interest in agenda items** - None.

**22/T22 Public Participation** - None.

**22/T23 Community Speed Watch Group** – A report (available [online](#)) was provided on speed monitoring activities since the 20mph scheme introduction. It was noted that the highest percentage of vehicles driving above 20mph were recorded at Oxford Road, Station Road and Hanborough Road. The network of Community Speed Watch Groups in the Thames Valley Police area has mushroomed in the 12 months since it started.

**22/T24 To receive an update from Sophia Vernon on behalf of Old Witney Road residents** – A draft letter from Sophia (on behalf of Old Witney Road residents) requesting funding for traffic calming measures was circulated. (Resolution 22/T19 (e) refers re traffic survey).

**22/T25 Speed reduction in and around Eynsham 20mph, 30mph and 40mph** – Given recent correspondence from residents in the Hanborough Road area and the Community Speed Watch statistics, it was agreed to:-

- (a) increase the number of Community Speed Watch sessions in the area.
- (b) display a banner on a Hanborough Road verge (subject to finding a suitable site on residential property with appropriate permission).
- (c) Support the 'Walk to School' week 16-20 May initiated by District Cllr Andy Goodwin.

It was **RECOMMENDED** to:-

- (d) ask Highways, Oxfordshire County Council to visit Old Witney Road and Hanborough Road with members to assess what physical traffic calming might be appropriate should speeds not reduce (as evidenced by traffic surveys 22/T19 (e) refers).
- (e) pursue installation of a Vehicle Activated Sign at Hanborough Road funded by the County Councillor's Priority Fund (as evidenced by traffic surveys 22/T19 (e) refers).
